#### A PLAY ON SHAPES.

As early as 1971, Jean Dinh Van had the intuition to combine the perfection of the circle with the rigour of the square. This aesthetic choice, which consists of inserting round shapes into square forms, has given rise to timeless creations, placing Jean Dinh Van at the heart of contemporary design.


By combining the spirituality of the round with the stability embodied by the square, Le Cube design offers an innovative vision based on geometry. An unexpected encounter between the softness of curves and the rigour of angles perceived as a dance of primary forms. This avant-garde creation around the squaring of the circle places Jean Dinh Van in a community of minds with the great designers of the 70s, a movement that captured the design era.

## DINH VAN, HEIR TO THE BAUHAUS MOVEMENT.

Dinh van, heir to the Bauhaus movement, continues to perpetuate this spirit today by seeking a union between form and function and exploring another essential element: colour.

Indeed, some of the Bauhaus masters popularised the association of colours with simple shapes, as vectors of emotion that feed off each other through association, opposition or complementarity.

It is in this vein that dinh van has chosen to combine the geometric precision of the cube with the spirituality associated with the colours of the sapphires. Like Kandinsky, who painted compositions as if they were musical works, dinh van has created a collection of rings, necklaces and bracelets adorned with dazzling blue, pink and yellow sapphires, to be worn solo, as a duo or in an accumulation to create your own symphony.







# THE SYMBOLISM OF SAPPHIRES.

The sapphire, a precious stone with bewitching reflections, has spanned the centuries, carrying with it an aura of mystery and power. A symbol of wisdom and truth in ancient times, sapphires can be used to fulfil every desire.
