
THE HOUSE OF DAMME



GILLES DEWAVRIN, COUNTRY AESTHETE AND PASSIONATE DESIGNER,

draws his inspiration from the colors of flowers and gardens, from small English and Dutch villages, or elsewhere. He re-invents atmospheres full of memories; melancholic souvenirs, sometimes magic but never dusty by introducing a dynamic play of tonic and acidulous colors reminding him of his British childhood spent in London.



Armchair"Feelgood Patchwork » by Gilles Dewavrin.




1960's wrought Iron Armchair, wrought iron table found at Deulin Fair, Belgium.



Seduced by the eccentricity of that time and of a literature which he fed on, such as that of Lewis Caroll, he imagines decors with disproportionate proportions and what he does not find to furnish his desires, he creates it.

Armchairs inspired by arts and crafts, neo-gothic, with modernized lines and altered volumes, covered with fabrics, a mixture of vintage and materials evocative of his bohemian style and described by himself as a "feel good patchwork", enchant him.

A resolutely "cabinet of curiosities" spirit is found in his meticulously organized interior. Gilles loves the mix of styles, a little Swedish and Italian vintage rubs shoulders with contemporary works by the Belgian artist tandem Hell'o. In this house, he particularly appreciates **the small ghosts** represented in their wall work as well as his Italian sofa covered with fabrics in the style of « Coronation Street", a television series that was difficult to escape at the time **in England.**

Over the years, Gilles has built a home near the Belgian coast, between the North Sea and Bruges, in the charming little town of Damme, Flanders. Two small fishermen's houses joined have been together to form one,

This house is somewhat similar to a suite in a hotel, which is the purpose of the house, because: "hotels do not accept his pack of dogs in their establishment", he says laughing.

Now there is a place where everyone can be together.

Throughout the house, Gilles has placed scented candles designed in collaboration with French perfumers. These candles are housed in **refillable containers**, made by artisans with whom he likes to communicate his desires for materials, shapes and colors.
