Best stand 2025

- Galerie SCENE OUVERTE (FR)

Galerie SCENE OUVERTE, located at 13 rue Bonaparte, Saint Germain des Prés, Paris, embodies the alliance between Contemporary creativity and artisanal excellence. In this space, beauty, craftsmanship and the sensations generated by materials converge to create a singular collection of art furniture and ceramics, offered as one-off pieces or very limited editions.

The gallery presents works by Vincent Dubourg, Rino Claessens, Caroline Desile, Silver Sentimenti and Saraï Delfendhal. The young designers and ceramists represented by the gallery share a vision that transcends the simple functionality of objects. Their intrinsic creative energy, nurtured by in-depth research into materials and know-how, places them within a History of the Decorative Arts. Each work thus becomes the unique story of an era, a total vision of creation.

Best solo 2025

- Sorry we're Closed (BE)
- The gallery presents a solo exhibition by Jun Kaneko.
- Jun Kaneko (b. 1942) is a Japanese American artist known for his large-scale ceramic sculptures. Based in a warehouse studio in Omaha, Nebraska, Kaneko works mainly in clay, exploring the effects of repeating abstract surface patterns using ceramic glaze.
- His artwork can be found in over fifty museum collections, including the Hawaii State Art Museum, the Honolulu Museum of Art, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the Museum of Arts and Design (New York), the Museum of Nebraska Art, the Sheldon Museum of Art, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Scripps College, the Shigaraki Ceramics Museum (Shigaraki,

Japan) and the Smithsonian American Art Museum. His most recent work is Water Plaza at Bartle Hall in Kansas City, Missouri. Kaneko has completed over twenty-five public art commissions worldwide. He has received national, state and organizational grants, as well as an honorary doctorate from London's Royal College of Art.

Sorry We're Closed is a contemporary art gallery founded by Sébastien Janssen in 2008. The gallery focuses on mid-career and emerging artists from Belgium and abroad. Since 2021, the gallery has been housed in a four-hundred-square-meter 19th-century mansion in the heart of the historic Sablons district. The gallery maintains a diverse exhibition program with solo shows by the gallery's artists as well as group exhibitions and special projects as jewelry by publishing artists.
